<u>Notifications of Arab Contracting Companies and Consulting Offices</u> <u>Projects and Technical Assistances funded by</u> Arab Bank for Economic Development in Africa (BADEA)-March 2023

Within the framework of BADEA's financing activities, the Board of Directors, in its session held for the period 15-17 March 2023, approved the provision of loans and technical assistances to some African countries.

The total amount of funding approved in this session amounted to **69.24M US\$**, of which **64.5M US\$** was allocated to contribute to the financing of 3 public sector projects, and **4.74 US\$ M** was allocated to finance 9 technical assistance operations.

Accordingly, the implementation of the works is expected to start in April 2024, the implementation will take about 18 months to be completed in September 2025, and the warranty period will take one year to be completed in September 2026.
