

Notifications of Arab Contracting Companies and Consulting Offices

For Projects and Technical Assistance operations funded by the

Arab Bank for Economic Development in Africa (BADEA) – July 2024

Within the framework of BADEA’s financing activities, the Board of Directors in its session held on 3 July 2024, approved the financing of operations from the public sector window for the benefit of some African countries, including two loans and seven technical assistance operations.

The total amount of funding approved in this session amounted to **72.530 million USD**, of which 70 million USD were allocated to contribute to the financing of two public sector projects, and 2.530 USD million to finance seven technical assistance operations.

The following is a statement of the operations that have been approved for financing:

Description and Components of the Project	<p>The project includes the following main components:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1- <u>Promoting Sustainable Agricultural Production</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Developing and modernizing irrigation systems: This includes developing and modernizing 2,398 hectares of irrigated land for sustainable production throughout the year. All systems within the various plans will use solar energy as a source of energy. ▪ Providing farmer empowerment packages: including supporting 20,000 farmers with water pumps (5% of which are solar-powered) and providing high-quality agricultural inputs. 2- <u>Strengthening Livestock Infrastructure and Developing the Value Chain:</u> This includes establishing pasture and fodder production centers, artificial insemination centers, milking parlors, collection centers, establishing a modern fish feed milling center, developing the international fish market in Maiduguri, and developing the poultry production center. 3- <u>Rural Infrastructure Development:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Farmer resettlement: Construction of 800 residential complexes to resettle 3,200 families. ▪ Providing solar energy: establishing eight small solar plants with a capacity of 500 kilowatts each. ▪ Development of rural roads: A total of 55 kilometers of rural roads were developed into gravel roads. 4- <u>Capacity Building for Agricultural and Livestock Value Chains:</u> This includes training 3,000 farmers and herders, training agricultural extension workers, establishing a farmers' field school, supporting agricultural cooperatives, and strengthening institutional capacities. 5- <u>Project Management, Monitoring and Evaluation:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Consulting services for project design and supervision ▪ Support the project implementation unit ▪ Developing the capabilities of the Federal Ministry of Finance and supporting monitoring and evaluation (M&E) activities. ▪ Project launch workshops and semi-interim and final evaluation of the project

<p>Procurement of Works, Goods and Services</p>	<p>Goods and services financed by the BADEA will be procured as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Civil and electromechanical works, equipment purchase and accompanying activities through tenders limited to local contracting companies. • Institutional/consultant services to conduct capacity development activities through shortlisting and Expression of Interest (EoI) from local service providers. • Selecting the consulting office for preparing engineering designs and tender documents and supervising implementation through a short list of joint Arab, African, or Arab-African offices. • Provision of IT equipment, vehicles and machinery to support the project implementation unit will be done by requesting proposals from approved local suppliers. • Recruitment of project implementation unit staff through a shortlist of qualified candidates in accordance with the state’s recruitment procedures for project implementation units and with the approval of the BADEA. • Organizing the project launch workshop and the midterm and final evaluation through local specialized agencies or institutions.
<p>Project Implementation Program</p>	<p>It is expected that the actual implementation of the works will take about 34 months, preceded by a period of 6 months during which the consulting office will be selected, the detailed designs and tender documents will be reviewed, tenders will be issued, and companies will be selected to carry out the civil works and their annexes. It is expected that the actual implementation of the works will begin in September 2025 and be completed at the end of June 2028.</p>

Description and Components of the Project	<p>The project to expand the transmission and distribution systems of the “Caringe” water purification plant in the capital, Kigali, was divided into two phases as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The first phase: including expanding the water purification plant from 12,000 cubic meters per day to 48,000 cubic meters per day, is financed by the Hungarian Exim Bank. - The second phase: including expanding the water supply network and distribution networks to the regions of Kigali and Rwamagana, which includes the following components: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1- <u>Civil Works for Water Network Facilities, including:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Supply and installation of water transmission lines including pumping stations and water tanks along 78 km from Karinge Water Purification Plant to Kigali. ▪ Construction and equipment of Kimishanga pumping station to pump purification station water and supply and installation of water transmission lines to Rwamagana District (Moyombo and Jhinjeri) with a length of 54 km. ▪ Supply and installation of water transmission lines from Karinge to Rwamagana, construction and equipment of 3 water distribution tanks (one tank with a capacity of 1,000 cubic meters and two tanks with a capacity of 2,500 cubic meters), and supply and installation of water distribution lines with a length of 38 km. ▪ Supply and installation of water distribution network lines in Nyakaliro Ndera and Rusoruru, with a length of 428 km, and construction and equipment of 7 tanks, including 4 tanks with a capacity of 100 cubic meters, a tank with a capacity of 500 cubic meters, and two tanks with a capacity of 2000 cubic meters. ▪ Supply and installation of water distribution network lines in the Jahangiri and Miombo areas, with a length of 116 km, and construction and equipment of 18 tanks, including 14 tanks with a capacity of 100 cubic meters and 4 tanks with a capacity of 500 cubic meters. 2- <u>Consultation Services:</u> These include preparing detailed designs and tender documents, assisting the implementing agency in issuing the tender, 	

	<p>evaluating offers, awarding contracts, and supervising the implementation of the works.</p> <p>3- <u>Project Launch Workshop and Semi-interim Evaluation Workshop.</u></p> <p>4- <u>Land acquisition:</u> This includes compensation for the owners of the lands and facilities that will be removed from the project area.</p> <p>5- <u>Project Management:</u> This includes operating expenses, logistics services, and providing transportation for the project implementation unit.</p> <p>6- <u>Auditing the Annual Accounts of the Project.</u></p>
Project Objectives	<p>In general, the project aims to contribute to achieving Goal #3 of the Sustainable Development Goals related to good health and well-being and Goal #6 providing clean water. The project is also consistent with the goals and aspirations of the Africa Agenda 2063, especially with Goal #1, which relates to providing a high standard of living, quality of life and well-being for all citizens.</p> <p>In particular, the project aim to increase access to safe water supply services in the Kigali and Rwamagana region, while enhancing the resilience of systems to climate change, and to provide clean water to about half a million people by 2035 compared to 120,000 people currently, and to increase Producing potable water by about 120,000 cubic meters per day by 2042, increasing the percentage of drinking water supply in the project area (the areas located East of the city) from 46% currently to 100% by 2035, and reducing the percentage of water loss in distribution networks from 42%. to 25% by 2035.</p>
Procurement of Works, Goods and Services	<p>Goods and services financed by the BADEA will be procured as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Implementing civil works for water network facilities through a tender limited to Arab and African or joint Arab African contracting companies. • Organizing the project launch workshop and the semi-interim evaluation workshop through local specialized agencies or institutions.
Project Implementation Program	<p>It is expected that the actual implementation of the project will take about 24 months, including 9 months for reviewing studies and awarding contracts. The actual implementation of the works is expected to begin in February 2026 and be completed in January 2028.</p>
